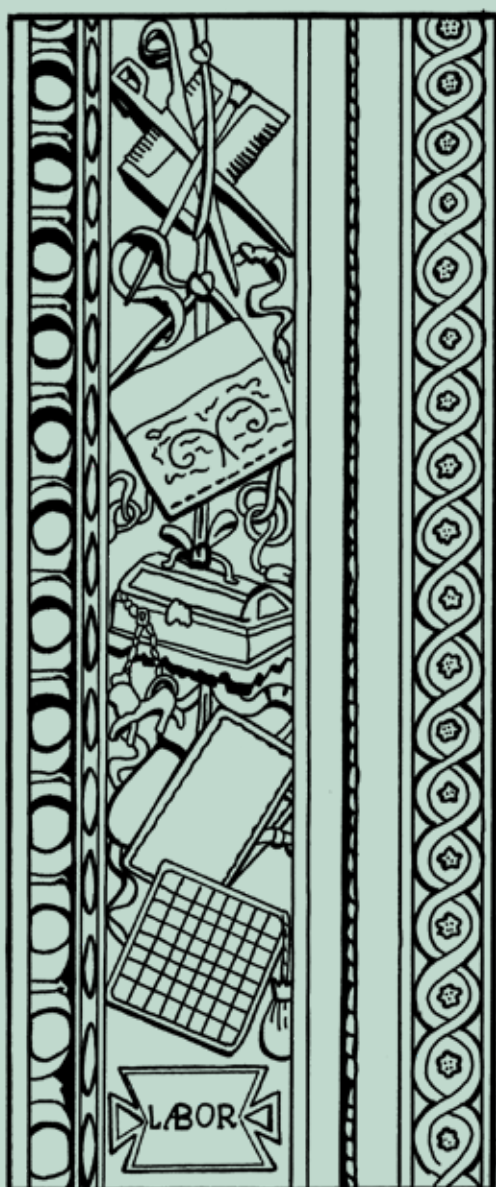


Bevilacqua Room

This was the room where Fausto enjoyed being with his friends, and where he listened to music. On the wall, there is a painting representing the Madonna and the Christ Child; did you find it? If you look carefully, you'll see that it's not only painted, but that it also uses different materials, such as fabric, velvet and little pearls. The artist of this painting was called Ambrogio Bevilacqua. The room is named after him.
